

Herbert W. (Bill) Powley inspires at Flight Instructor Hall of Fame Ceremony.

Kalamazoo, MI, July 27, 2023

A ceremony attended by more than 100 flight instructors and other aviation professionals saw the induction of famed CFI Lt. Col. Herbert W. (Bill) Powley, USAF (Ret.) into the Flight Instructor Hall of Fame. Powley joins an elite group of individuals who have been recognized for their significant contributions to flight instruction.

NAFI Chairperson, Karen Kalishek introduced Lt. Col Powley at the ceremony held during the National Association of Flight Instructors' annual breakfast meeting at AirVenture 2023. Powley then gave an inspirational address that touched on the many lessons he learned throughout his distinguished career in aviation, beginning with graduating from the U.S. Air Force Academy followed by more than 23 years as a fighter pilot, flight instructor, and test pilot, including two tours in Vietnam flying 347 missions.



But the main focus of Powley's address was the foundation he formed after retirement from the Air Force. His FLIGHT Foundation (Flight Lesson Instructional Grants Helping Teens) was created to introduce young people to aviation. Powley has personally raised over \$1.9 million. He has flown almost 12,000 students on more than 4,000 discovery flights, most of which were free.

Powley has been an active member and leader in many aviation organizations, including the Air Force Association, Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association, the Experimental Aircraft Association and NAFI. In 2010 he received the A Scott Crossfield Aerospace Science Teacher of the Year Award from the National Aviation Hall of Fame. The Tennessee Aviation Hall of Fame (TAHOF) created a special award to recognize him that same year (Tennessee Aviation Person of the Year). In 2011 he received Tennessee's highest aviation recognition, the Career Contributions to Aviation Award. In 2013, was inducted into the Tennessee Aviation Hall-of-Fame.

NAFI Chairman Emeritus Robert Meder presented Lt. Col Powley with an award to recognize his induction into the Flight Instructor Hall of Fame.
